Company Analysis

Demand - Demand for Vital Farms' products remains robust, driven by premium branding that emphasizes ethical production and sustainability.

Financial highlights for the fiscal year ended December 29, 2024 (52 weeks), compared to the fiscal year ended December 31, 2023 (53 weeks), include:

- Net Revenue increased 28.5% to \$606.3 million, compared to \$471.9 million
- Gross Margin expanded 352 basis points to 37.9%, compared to 34.4%
- Net Income grew 108.8% to \$53.4 million, compared to \$25.6 million
- Net Income per Diluted Share of \$1.18, compared to \$0.59
- Adjusted EBITDA of \$86.7 million, compared to \$48.3 million¹

- We pitched their stability and industry growth potential, especially their positioning to react quickly to consumer preferences.
- They purchased **Poppi** for \$1.95B a prebiotic soda brand, hoping to grow the health-conscious section of their brand portfolio.



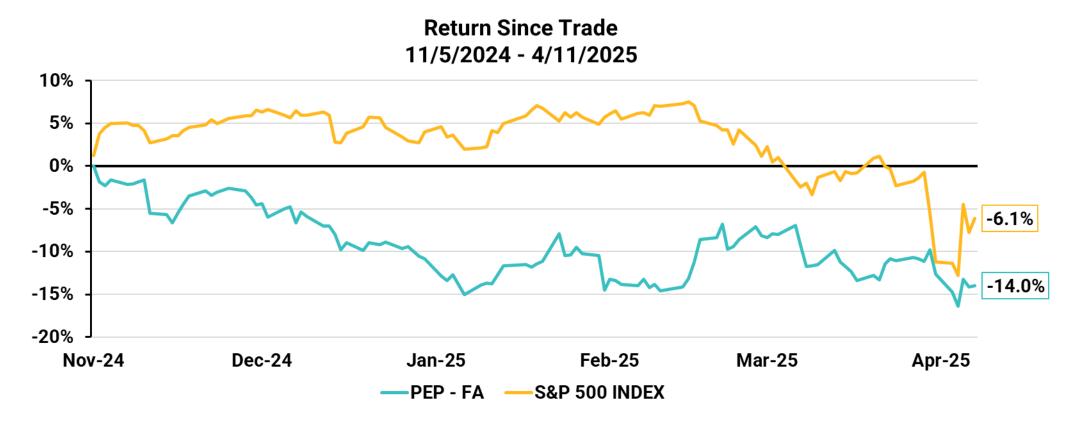

Cash Allocation Strategy

- Invest \$900,000 in Ultra-Short-Term T-Bills, Total Market, and Gold ETFs
 - \$300,000 ICSH (iShares: Ultra-Short-Term Bonds ETF)
 - \$300,000 SGOV (iShares: 0-3 Month Treasury Bond ETF)
 - \$200,000 VTI (Vanguard Total Stock Market ETF)
 - \$100,000 IAU (iShares Gold Trust)
- Rationale: Maintain a low beta to limit market exposure while maximizing liquidity
- Allocating more defensively positions us to weather downturns effectively.

- Targets growth stocks with strong potential and high risk-adjusted returns, using Bloomberg screens for top total returns, lucrative Sharpe ratios, and a favorable PEG ratio.

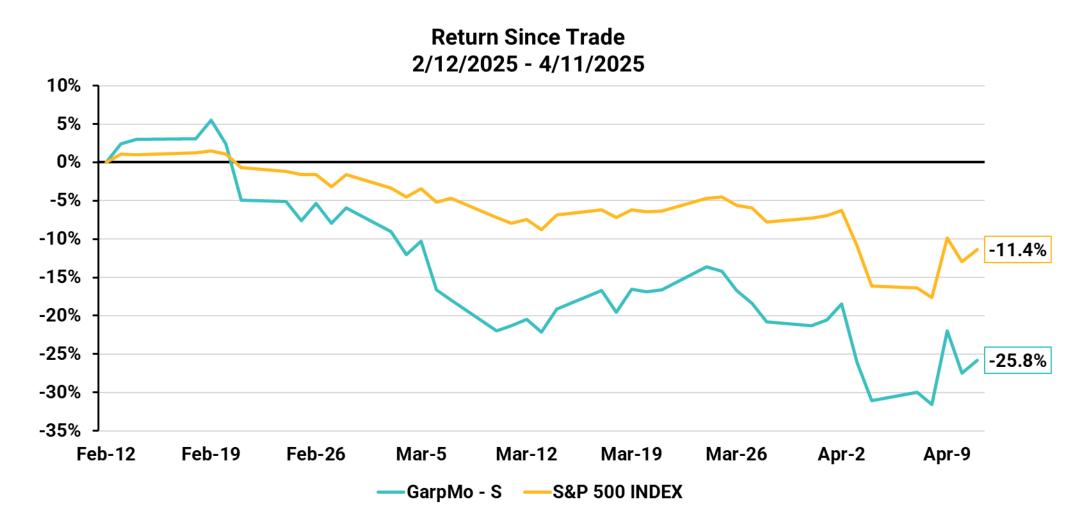

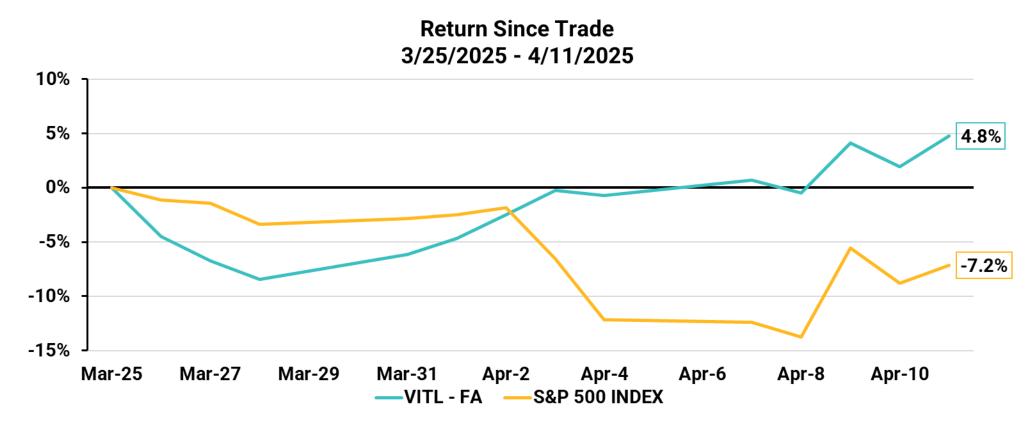

Tyson Foods – Fundamental Strategy

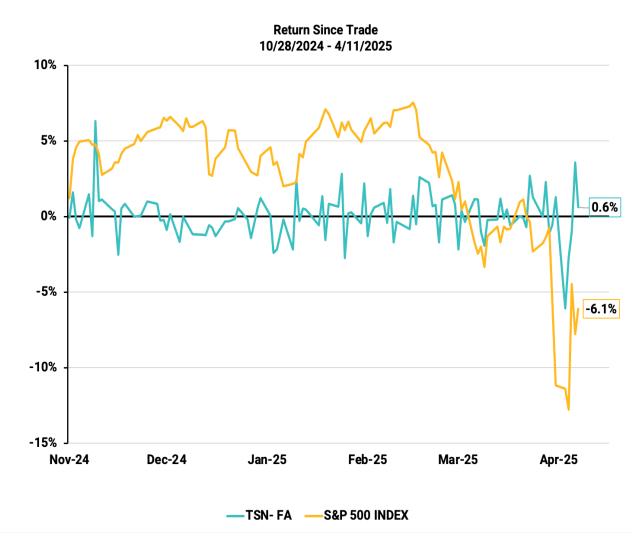
Recommendation: Buy \$20k (Rejected)

Our Rationale:

- **Diversification Reduces Risk:** Broad product range (chicken, beef, pork, and plant-based proteins) helps hedge against risks.
- Operational Efficiency and Automation: Investments in automation technology and sustainability initiatives support lower production costs.
- Vertically Integrated Business Model: Tyson controls every stage of production, from sourcing to processing to distribution.
- **Expansion:** New footprint in emerging international markets like Asia-Pacific, capitalizing on growing demand for protein products.

Results:

- If the strategy was accepted, the proposed \$20k would be worth \$20,841 as of April 11th a 4.1 % increase.
- We learned that we needed to be more *confident* in our decision and that ability to advise against when presenting on an investment.







UBER – Fundamental Strategy

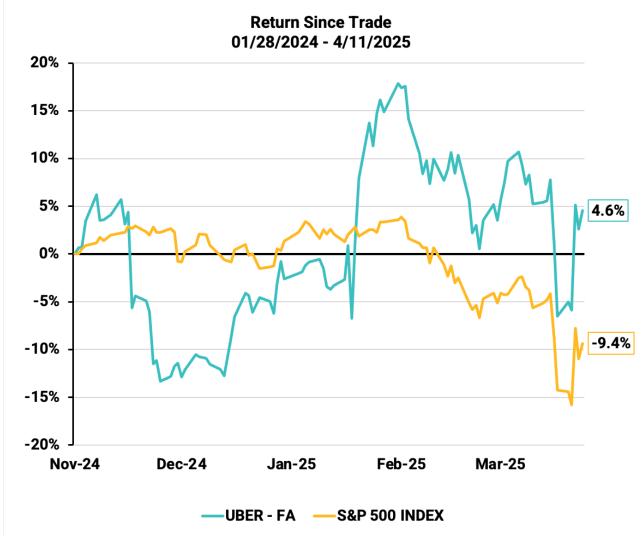
Recommendation: Buy \$7k and Hold Long-term (Accepted)

Our Rationale:

- Market Leadership: Global leader in ride-hailing and food delivery services, operating in over 70 countries and 10,000 cities.
- Growth Potential: Market diversification, strategic expansions like Uber Eats and freight logistics, and advancements in autonomous vehicles.
- Valuation Upside: Potential upside driven by strong market trends, operational efficiency, and continued revenue growth.

Results:

- The proposed \$6.9k is worth **\$7.2k** as of April 11th a 5.1% increase.
- Outperformed the S&P500 by 14%.
- Spike in February was driven by positive investor sentiment fueled by strong earnings reports.







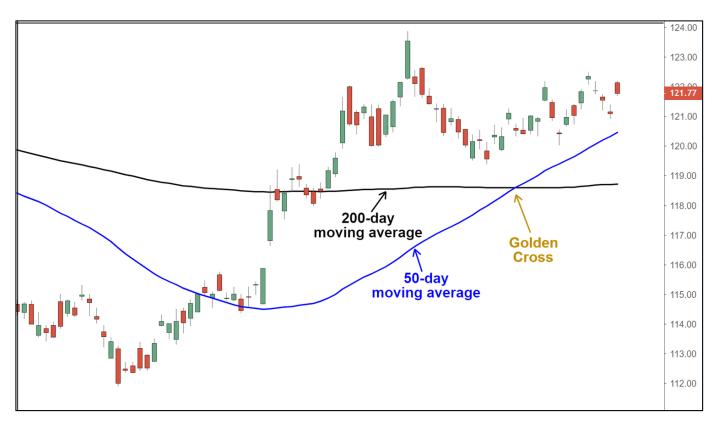
Golden Cross – Systematic Strategy

Momentum Growth Strategy:

A golden cross occurs when a **short-term moving average** crosses **above a long-term moving average**. It's often represented by the **50-day simple moving average** (SMA) crossing above the **200-day SMA**.

How to Benefit:

Identify the **shorter-term moving average** or signal line rising **above** the **longer-term component**. As current or short-term prices move higher, the shorter-term component will naturally rise above average prices over the longer term.



Candlestick charts reveal price momentum by visualizing the range between open and close, with larger candlesticks indicating stronger momentum.





Golden Cross – Systematic Strategy (Results)

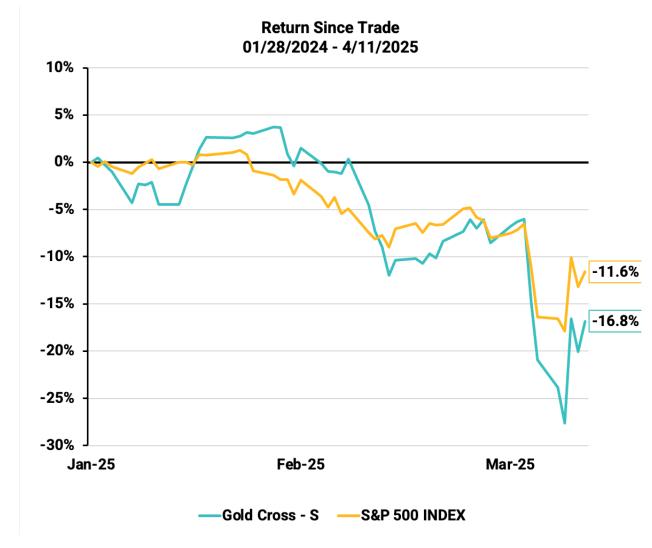
Recommendation: Buy \$12k and Hold Medium-term (Accepted)

Results:

- The proposed \$12k is worth \$9.9K as of April 11th a 18.7% decrease.
- Underperformed the S&P500 by 5.2%.

The Strategy Underperformed due to....

- Market Volatility: The strategy was activated during a high-volatility period in Q1 2025, triggering buy signals just before a steep market decline.
- Lagging Indicator: GC relies on moving averages which react slowly to real-time market reversals, resulting in late exits and missed sell opportunities.
- No Stop-Loss Mechanism: Without any stop-loss or dynamic rebalancing triggers, the strategy remained exposed during drawdowns, compounding losses.
- **Broader Market Decline:** While the S&P 500 dropped approximately -11.6% by April 11, GC dropped further (-16.8%) due to its momentum lag.







C'mon C'mon Commodities - Macro Strategy

Recommendation: Buy \$50k (Accepted)

Our Rationale:

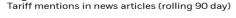
Create a resilient, inflation-hedged portfolio using diversified commodity exposure.

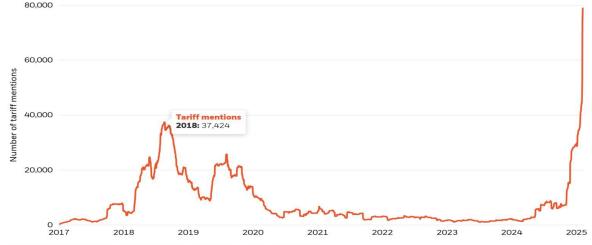
- Tariffs & Supply Chain Disruptions: Rising protectionism and trade barriers driving input cost volatility.
- Inflation Hedge: Commodities historically outperform during inflationary and macro-uncertain periods.
- Climate Change: Extreme weather events and water scarcity increasing commodity price instability.
- Al Boom & Infrastructure Investment: Industrial metals and water resources facing higher demand from chip manufacturing and datacenter cooling systems.

Results:

- The proposed \$49.7k is worth \$49.8k as of April 11th a 0.12% decrease.
- Outperformed the S&P500 by 6.4%.
- · Recommend future cohorts to rebalance when tariffs settle down.

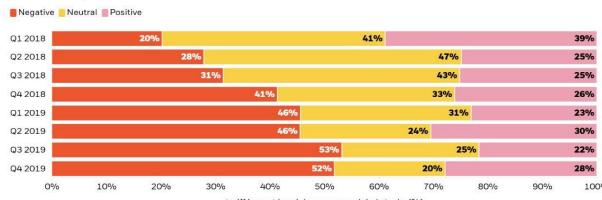
Figure 2: Attention to tariffs across news articles has already surpassed 2018/2019 highs

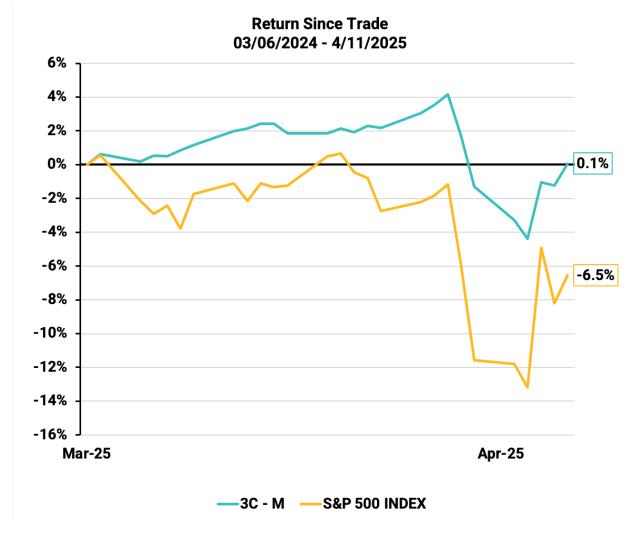

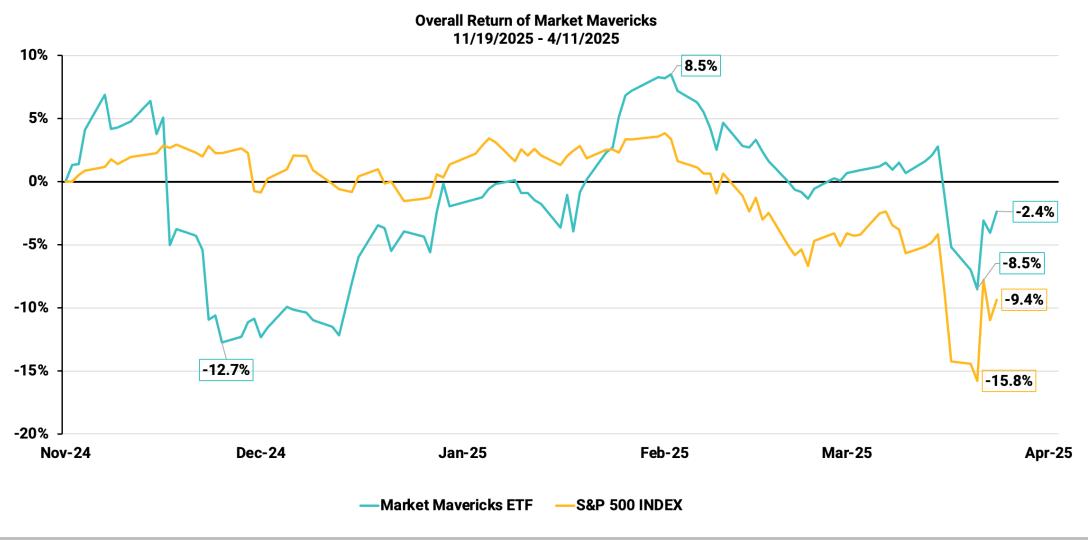

Our Thesis:

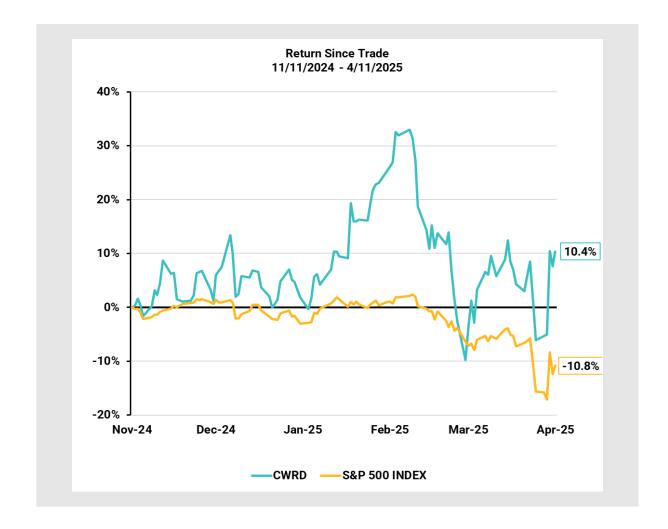
That CrowdStrike had not only recovered value from its summer outage, but had become overvalued relative to its peers and rivals; **recommended** <u>against</u> <u>purchase</u>

How It Played Out:

- Despite volatility in tech space, the proposed \$7,500 investment would be worth \$8,280 today - an increase of 10.4%

Where We Went Wrong:

- Overly focused on P/E ratio
- Valuation Analysis







CRWD - Improvements

- Our comparative analysis focused on technology niche peers (Trend Micro, SentinelOne, Sophos) rather than complementary market share peers (Microsoft, AWS, SFDC)
- DCF valuations to create estimation of value per share didn't capture what the market views as future upside
- Current valuation is more reflective of general market uncertainty (all time high of \$455.36/share achieved Feb 6th)





Cash Allocation Strategy

Our Thesis:

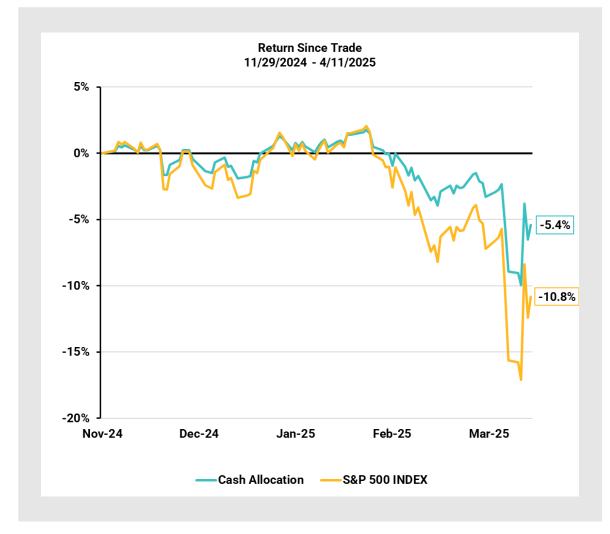
Allocate our cash based on our fund's target metrics, prioritizing our target beta of 0.70, allowing us to gain exposure to market returns as we continue to allocate our funds. Future pitches can decide how to draw down from this allocation, depending on the pitch's beta.

How It Played Out:

- Outperformed the S&P 500 by 5.4%
- Negative return over the period
- Fund mostly drew down from SPY

Where We Went Wrong:

- Should have researched alternative market indices
- Initial pitch called for a 5% cash allocation for liquidity







Cash Allocation - Improvements

- Could've done more research on potential downsides, having a better idea of the risks this strategy proposed
- Lots of focus on historical performance, incorporating market forecasts would have enhanced the pitch
- SPY's Large Cap and Info. Tech. concentration may have been mitigated with a blend of market ETFs, helping diversify the riskier portion of our cash allocation





Staples & Stethoscopes

Our Thesis:

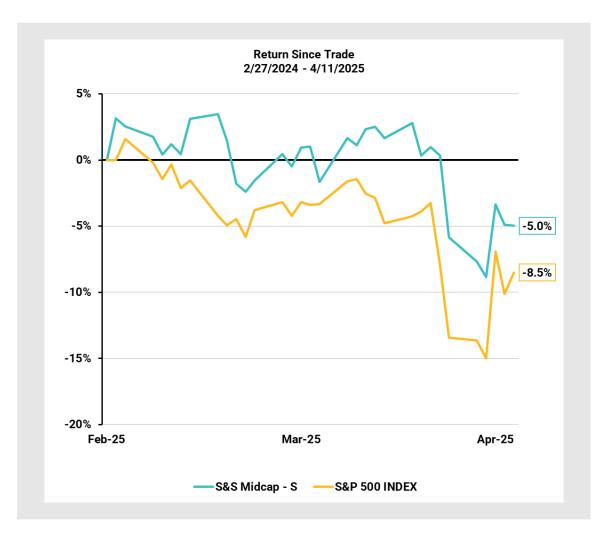
The main thesis of this investment strategy is to achieve diversification and capitalize on market inefficiencies by focusing on mid-cap stocks with strong free cash flow in sectors like Healthcare, Consumer Staples, Utilities, and Materials for the purpose of gaining and exposure and diversification in our fund holdings

How It Played Out:

- Outperformed the S&P 500 by 3.5%
- Negative return over the period
- Chose some pretty defensive stocks

Where We Went Wrong:

- Company Evaluation
- Higher Allocation to Healthcare than Staples







S&S - Improvements

- Could've done a deeper dive into the stocks we invested in with this strategy, specifically a deeper dive into what they do
- Wish we had looked into how these companies might fair under Tariffs and Economic turmoil
- Higher emphasis on Consumer Staples would have been better in hindsight (PPC is doing great, if only there were more of them)





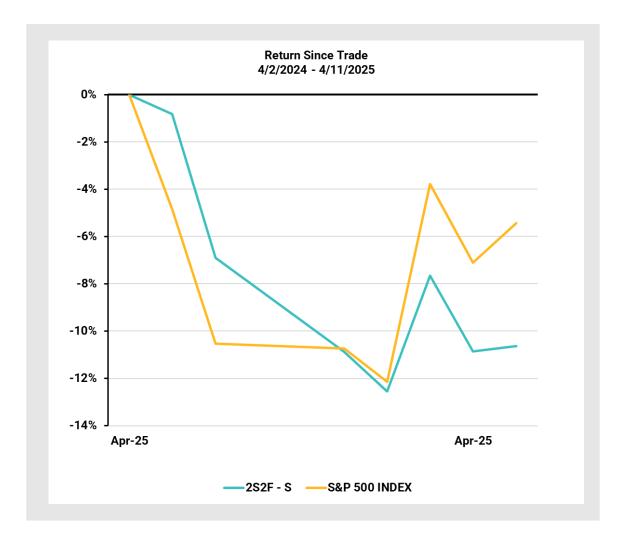
Too Small To Fail

Our Thesis:

We believed small-cap financial services were undervalued and poised for a rebound following improved capitalization in the sector. The strategy aimed to add exposure and enhance fund diversification by targeting small-cap firms with healthy fundamentals.

How It Played Out:

- Underperformed the SPY by 5.2%
- Outperformed S&P 600 by 3.3%
- Risk-adjusted returns didn't justify increased exposure
- Strategy leaned too conservative for a small-cap allocation







2S2F - Improvements

- Small-cap financials were more cyclical than expected not as defensive.
- Valuation screens (P/E, dividend) may have been overly restrictive.
- Strategy lacked a strong risk-adjusted return case.
- A "stock characteristics" slide should be added to show what we're actually allocating to.

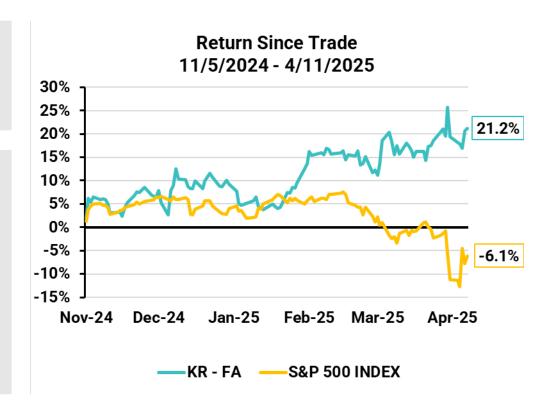

Our Thesis: To identify stable, low beta and high return grocery retail company.

How It Played Out: The stock is up 19% overall. The price went up as high as 71.93, i.e 25%. It beat SPX which has return of -6%.

As it has Beta of 0.6 (historical 5 year). We proposed \$30,000 to be invested which wasn't approved.







META

Our Thesis: To identify an undervalued Tech company with strong growth potential in the metaverse and digital advertising, backed by solid financials and market alignment.

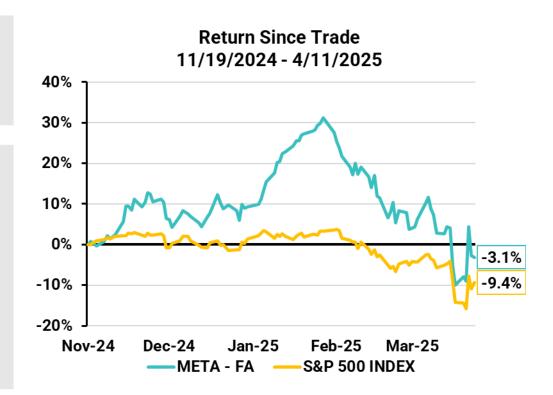
How It Played Out: META surged to a peak of 31.3% by February, strongly outperforming SPY, which topped at 3.8%.

Both saw sharp declines afterward, with META ending at -3.1% and SPY at -9.4%.

META showed stronger momentum but also higher volatility.

It still outperformed SPY overall during the period.

The strategy captured gains early but struggled in the downturn.





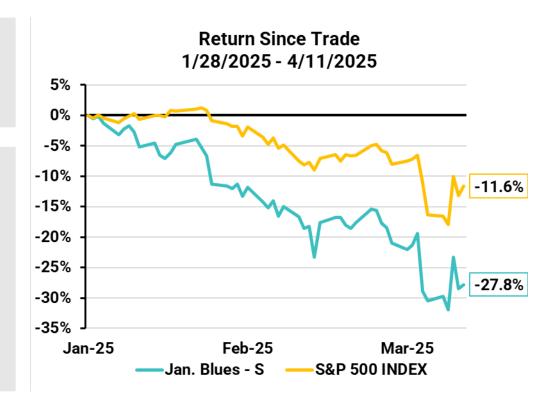


Surviving January Blues

Our Thesis: Look for stocks that have less volatility than the market which would be considered underpriced.

How It Played Out: Turned out to be more volatile than expected. Selected stocks were too narrow to diversify the risk and mitigate the losses. These two sectors were prone to increased As a result, they responded more negatively than the market.

The strategy is down -27.8% since the day of sale







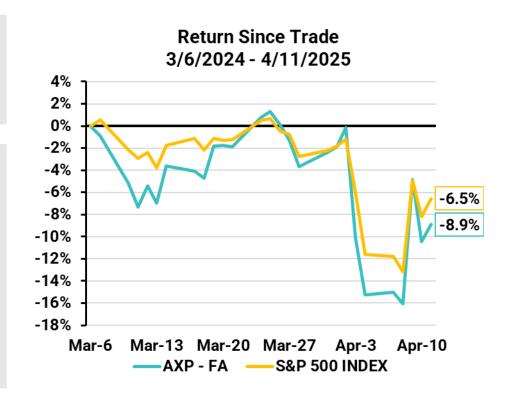
AMEX

Our Thesis: AMEX is a highly profitable vertically integrated credit car company that serves higher end customers. AMEX has had higher returns than XFL by 50%.

How It Played Out:

XFL is down 5.4% since 3/6 The Stock is sensitive to rising unemployment and household debt.

Has been trending down before the tariffs.







Lessons Learned

Description

Focus on investing in low beta stocks which will reduce our exposure to the market as it is going to be volatile like it was in 2018 after the trade war started. We believe the market will perform similar to how it was performing before 2017- 2020 when COVID-19 hit.

Goal

High return with lower exposure to the market so we will be investing in low beta stocks.

Parameters

We should focus on implementing strategies according to the risk metrics of the fund in future. We believe there is going to be high volatility therefore instead of implementing systematic strategy we should go for fundamental strategies as only stable companies with stable cashflows will be able to give higher returns than market.
